

On May 10-19, 2014, a delegation of Department of Justice, including Deputy Director Lin Zhe-Hui, chief clerk Qiu Li-fen and clerk Liu ting-Yu of legal system department visited Geneva, Switzerland, to conduct a survey of human rights business. The topics of survey included the experience of establishment and operation of national human rights institutions, the review of laws in line with the Convention on Human Rights, setting the order of priorities of human rights education, evaluation of human rights and practice of human rights impact assessment, the follow-up implementation of concluding observations, the notes of writing and review of national human rights report, housing rights and evictions, guarantee the right to food, death penalty and anti-torture, relationship between human rights and freedom of trade or commerce. There were a total of 7 sessions exchange activities and 14 people participated in this event.
